## MID-TERM REPORT CARDS

- Mid-term Report Cards will not be issued as communicated from the Ministry of Education for all School boards and Private Schools.
- Grade 12 students will be emailed their marks on April 20<sup>th</sup> as marks are sent to OUAC for university admissions.
- Parents can access the Parent Portal on Maplewood to see updated student marks after April 24<sup>th</sup>. Please note that Username and Passwords to access the portal was sent out in the Sem. 1 Final Report Cards Envelope.
- OSSLT (English Literacy test) has been cancelled for this year

# **HOW WILL MY CHILD BE ASSESSED?**

- Teachers will assign learning tasks, projects and culminating activities for assessment purposes.
- Teachers will communicate results and feedback to students about these marked assignments and results will inform students' final course marks.
- **Final exams** are cancelled and will be replaced by a final Culminating task.
- Final marks will be reported in June 2020.

#### STUDENT EXPECTATIONS

- Students must continue to attend and stay up to date with assigned work
- For live lessons it is mandatory for all students to have their cameras on – this is for safety reasons as there have been many reports of uninvited users joining a Zoom session and doing inappropriate things
- Students are expected to complete all assigned work during this time as it will reflect in their final marks
- Attendance is being taken to ensure continuity in student learning and no student is falling behind

## **GRADE 12s**

- Any student graduating who has not completed the 40hrs of community service requirement will still be able to graduate. This requirement is waived at this time for Graduates of 2020.
- Mid-term marks will be emailed to students on April 20<sup>th</sup> before being sent to OUAC
